TRAINING VEHICLE

- \checkmark Vehicle class used: Motorcycles up to 250cc (cruiser, sport, kick-start). Riders may not train with their own bikes
- \sim Required insurance: Liability \$5,000,000, motorcycles have required insurance Vehicle signage
- \checkmark Passenger restrictions: No passengers allowed
- Additional vehicle requirements

INSTRUCTOR REGULATIONS (ON-VEHICLE)

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

Successfully complete in-vehicle evaluation – MOST (Motorcycle Operator Skills Test)

FOLLOWING PROGRAM COMPLETION

- Completion Certificate issued to rider
- Time-reduction in GDL program (number of months)
- Insurance discount

PRACTICE DRIVING (WITH PARENT/GUARDIAN)

- Minimum practice driving hours
- □ Maximum period to complete the practice hours
- Practice hours recorded on a log sheet

SUPERVISOR (PARENT/GUARDIAN) REGULATIONS

No supervising driver required
