

SASKATCHEWAN DRIVER EDUCATION STANDARDS: PASSENGER VEHICLES

Overview

Regulating agency: Saskatchewan Safety Council Effective date of regulations enacted:

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum enrolment age to driver education program: 15 if attending an SGI approved high school driver education program
- Minimum age of 16 for the 6 & 6 Commercial Program (6 hours in-car and 6 hours in-class training)

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

- High School Program
 - Must be a high school student
 - Parent/guardian consent
 - ☑ SGI pays for the program

☑ 6 & 6 Commercial Program

- Must hold a valid learner's licence
- ☑ The driver pays for the program
- All training must be complete before the learner may attempt a road test

COURSE STRUCTURE

In-classroom

- Minimum total number of hours: 30 hours of mandatory training through High School Driver Education Program; or 6 hours from a licensed driving instructor
- Number of sessions: Varies with each high school; some schools may administer the program throughout the whole school year (September to June), some may do the program over a semester, some may do the program in six weeks; schedules are determined to fit the needs of the students, school and educator. The commercial program has 6 hours inclass. Some educators teach all 6 hours in one day, three 2hour sessions, two 3-hour sessions, or six 1-hour sessions.
- ☑ Length of each session: Varies, see above.

In-vehicle, on range/track

- Minimum total number of hours

In-vehicle, on road

- Minimum total number of hours: 6 hours

- ☑ Length of each session: Maximum of 2 hours a day, students are encouraged to practice the skills they've learned from their educator between sessions with a supervising driver.

Driving simulator

- Minimum total number of hours: Simulator hours are not required, however, SGI will accept up to 8 hours of driver simulation, which is equal to 2 in-car hours. (4 hours simulation = 1 hour in-car driving)

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COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

- □ Successfully complete minimum in-classroom instruction hours
- Successfully complete in-classroom evaluation
- Successfully complete minimum in-vehicle instruction hours
- Successfully complete in-vehicle evaluation
- Educators must submit class lists
- Educators must keep a copy of class records for 5 years

PRACTICE DRIVING (WITH PARENT/GUARDIAN)

- Minimum practice driving hours
- Maximum period to complete the practice hours
- Practice hours recorded on a log sheet: optional
- Practicing is strongly encouraged but the above points are not mandated at this time.

FOLLOWING PROGRAM COMPLETION

- Driver education certification issued to student: A Driver Education Certificate will be issued by the instructor upon completion of students' training and must be presented to the driver examiner prior to a road test.
- □ Time-reduction in GDL program (number of months)
- Insurance discount

SUPERVISOR (PARENT/GUARDIAN) REGULATIONS

- Minimum Age
- ☑ Licence held: Hold a minimum of a valid Class 5 driver's licence
- ☑ Time licensed: A minimum of 365 days in the preceding three years (but is not a novice driver).
- At all times, be capable of assuming operation of the vehicle (the learner driver cannot be the designated driver for an impaired supervisor driver)
- BAC level while supervising
- ☑ Location while supervising: Occupy the seat nearest to the driver and the vehicle controls
- Driver log
