INSTRUCTOR REGULATIONS (IN-CLASS)

- Certifications/designations: Must pass recognized driver training course and obtain driver training licence
- Age
- Licence held: Holds a PEI operator's license valid for the year in which the application to give instruction is made; and holds a valid license for the class of vehicle for which they offer instruction
- Driver/Criminal record check: The Director may refuse to issue a license to any person who within five years previous to the date of the application:
 - has been convicted of any offence under sections 68, 81, 82(3), 91, 176, 231, 232 or 239 of the Act;
 - whose driver's license has been suspended, cancelled or revoked under the provisions of sections 261, 262 or 264 of the Act, the Demerit Point System Regulations or these regulations; or
 - has been prohibited from driving or whose driver's license or privilege of obtaining a driver's license has
 - been suspended or revoked pursuant to the provisions of the Act or the Criminal Code (Canada) (EC810/84)
- Minimum driving experience: Has been licensed as a vehicle operator in a Canadian jurisdiction for at least 5 years

TRAINING VEHICLE REGULATIONS

- Vehicle class used
- Dual control brakes
- Automatic / manual transmission
- Required insurance: Motor vehicles provided by a driving school or an must have a motor vehicle liability insurance policy in an amount not less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00)
- Vehicle signage: The words "Driver Training" must be marked in letters at least 100mm in height in a manner approved by the Director, on both sides and at the rear of the vehicle
- Passenger restrictions
- Additional vehicle requirements

INSTRUCTOR REGULATIONS (IN-VEHICLE)

- Certifications/designations: Must pass recognized driver training course and obtain driver training licence
- Age
- ☑ Licence held: Same as in-class instructors
- Minimum driving experience: 5 years, same as in-class instructors
- Driver/Criminal record check: Same as in-class instructors; see above
- Location in vehicle while instructing
- BAC level while supervising: Zero
- Additional regulations

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

- Successfully complete minimum in-classroom instruction hours
- Successfully complete in-classroom evaluation
- Successfully complete minimum in-vehicle instruction hours
- Successfully complete in-vehicle evaluation

PRACTICE DRIVING (WITH PARENT/GUARDIAN)

- Minimum practice driving hours
- Maximum period to complete the practice hours
- Practice hours recorded on a log sheet

FOLLOWING PROGRAM COMPLETION

- Driver education certification issued to student
- ☑ Time-reduction in GDL program (number of months): 3 months
- ☑ Insurance discount

SUPERVISOR (PARENT/GUARDIAN) REGULATIONS

- Minimum Age
- ☑ Licence held: Licence of class being learned
- ☑ Time licensed: 4 years
- ☑ BAC level while supervising: 0.05
- Location while supervising
- Driver log
